



## HOW TO OBTAIN YOUR MEDICAL CANNABIS CARD

### GET CERTIFIED BY A PHYSICIAN

1

- Visit an Ohio certified physician who can confirm that you have a qualifying condition and have the physician create your profile in the patient and caregiver registry.
- When you visit the doctor, be sure to take government-issued identification, including minors.

#### Acceptable forms of ID:

Unexpired Ohio driver's license

Unexpired Ohio identification card issued by the Ohio BMV (adults & minors)

Unexpired US passport or US passport card (adults & minors)

### MAKE PAYMENT

2

- Once you have received your recommendation from your physician, your physician's office will enter you into the patient registry.
- You will receive an email confirmation to complete your registration.
- Confirm your information and pay \$50 annual registration fee for your card.
- Download your card. You can print a copy or wait for your card to come in the mail.

### PURCHASE

3

- Purchase medical cannabis from an approved dispensary in Ohio.
- Remember to bring to the dispensary the form of government-issued identification you used to register with the State of Ohio in Step 1.



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### CAREGIVER INSTRUCTIONS

**STEP 1:** Present valid identification at the certifying doctor's office and be added to the patient registry by the physician.

**Acceptable forms of ID:**

- Unexpired Ohio driver's license
- Unexpired Ohio identification card issued by the Ohio BMV (adults & minors)
- Unexpired US passport or US passport card (adults & minors)

**STEP 2:** The patient will receive an email confirmation to complete their registration. Confirm the information and pay the \$25 annual registration fee. Download the card and either print a copy or wait for your card to come in the mail.

**STEP 3:** To purchase medical cannabis from an approved dispensary in Ohio present the valid government-issued identification you used to register in Step 1 and the patient registry card.

### QUALIFYING CONDITIONS

- AIDS
- Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis
- Alzheimer's Disease
- Cancer
- Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy
- Crohn's Disease
- Epilepsy or another seizure disorder
- Fibromyalgia
- Glaucoma
- Hepatitis C
- Inflammatory Bowel Disease
- Multiple Sclerosis
- Pain that is either chronic and severe or intractable
- Parkinson's Disease
- Positive status for HIV
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder
- Sickle Cell Anemia
- Spinal Cord disease or Injury
- Tourette's Syndrome
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Ulcerative Colitis
